## Annex 7 referred to in Chapters 7 and 8 Reservations for Future Measures

- 1. The Schedule of a Party sets out, pursuant to paragraph 3 of Articles 66 and 101, the reservations taken by that Party with respect to specific sectors, sub-sectors or activities for which it may maintain existing, or adopt new or more restrictive, measures that do not conform with obligations imposed by:
  - (a) Article 58 or 98 (National Treatment);

- 2. Each reservation sets out the following elements:

  - (e) "Description" sets out the scope of the sector, sub-sector or activities covered by the reservation; and
  - (f) "Existing Measures" identifies, for transparency purposes, existing measures that apply to the sector, sub-sector or activities covered by the reservation.
- 3. In the interpretation of a reservation, all elements of the reservation shall be considered. The "Description" element shall prevail over all other elements.

- 4. Nothing in this Annex shall affect interpretation of the provision of subparagraph 2(c) of Article 97 with respect to measures affecting traffic rights in air transport services or services directly related to the exercise of such traffic rights.
- 5. Nothing in the reservation for Article 65 lodged in the Schedule of Japan shall be construed so as to derogate from the obligations of Japan under the Agreement on Trade Related Investment Measures in Annex 1A to the WTO Agreement.
